Online Safety

As you know we have been sending out regular newsletters about how to keep your child safe online. We cover online safety regularly throughout day to day activities, special days and RSHE sessions.

Over the last few weeks the children in KS2 have completed an anonymous questionnaire about online safety. The results will be shared with you in a separate email. Please take time to read through the results as some of our findings are surprising but do reflect the national picture about children's exposure to inappropriate online content. The newsletter explains how you can keep your child safe online.

As a school, we take online safety seriously and have the highest level of filters in place so that children cannot access unsafe sites. We also do not let children bring mobile phones into school so that children remain safe from inappropriate mobile phone use in school time.
